PHOENIX (February 18) – A new [website](#), Maricopa County Competes, was launched this month as a partnership between Maricopa County and the Greater Phoenix Economic Council (GPEC).

In a survey of active clients, companies have routinely requested information on Maricopa County processes, such as Air Quality Permits, Workforce Support, Industrial Development Authority Financing Provisions and Foreign Trade Zones. The new microsite, which visitors can access from GPEC's [homepage](#), allows prospective business expansions to quickly maneuver through the County departments to expeditiously obtain the information they desire.
